Reverend Georgia M. Reash Creative Bio



Georgia M. Reash is a transformative multi-artist harnessing the power of creativity to heal and prevent trauma. Since 2000, her work as a poet, playwright, artist, author and lecturer has been inspired by her own mental health, spiritual and professional journey. Accompanying Georgia's arts career is her leadership as President of BrightSpot Communities LLC, a global company building vibrant, equitable and sustainable communities. In addition, she is the co-founder of I Am Woman and this is MY Story[©], a healing arts movement giving voice to the power of women.

As a visual artist, Georgia's most recent art installation, #53 Vaginas and Vulvas[©] (2020) offers a provocative 53-piece collection of colorful abstract vaginas and vulvas, painted in honor of the 53 U.S. million women raped between 2000 and 2020. #53 Vaginas and Vulvas[©] offers a unique community impact event that weaves art, words, humor and conversation into a powerful awareness experience. Additional exhibits include Metamorphosis: A PTSD Healing Journey (2012) and Melodies of Reproductive Justice: The Classical Vulvas Collection[©] (2022), a collaborative project with gender equity educator and daughter, Haley Reash-Henz.

Georgia's passion for writing spans a lifetime, with her play, *Journey of the Hummingbird Minister*[©] (2009) produced as a dynamic phoenix-rising testimony. Her first non-fiction book, *I Want Good Sex: Reclaiming the Power of Your Sensuality After Living with Abuse, Assault or Stupid Meanies*[©] (anticipated 2023), offers a creative self-help roadmap for reclaiming sensual depth, authentic sexual expression and personal identity. Her recent publication, *Finding the Home Within: Encouraging Thoughts for Those Looking for Home*[©] (2022) shares poetic encouragement for challenging times; added poetry chap books include *Weed Flowers: Sensualities*[©] (2018) and *The Creatrix Life*[©] (2008).

Georgia's creative works have also been featured via multiple competitions; Ohio Beacon Arts, Equity Literature, The Healing Arts Project, Women Who Roar, Hessler Street Fair and The Scheherazade Project. She is also the creator of multiple community based arts ventures including *The Power of Word, Living into Light and Dark*, and *Heal the Wound*. In the space of healing and justice-making, Georgia serves on the Board of Directors for the Scheherazade Project.

In addition to decades of study across psychological, spiritual, family and community development, Georgia's educational background includes *Social Work* (BA Social Science, Cleveland State University), *Spiritual Direction and Ministry* (Universal Life Ministries) and *Whole Systems Wellness and Healing* (Reiki Certifications). As a global mental health and community wellness advocate, she is dedicated to creating solutions for sustainable change.
