#### **Art Exhibit Overview**



**#53 Vaginas and Vulvas**<sup>©</sup> **(#53VV)** is a 53-piece art installation created by artist, author, and violence prevention advocate Georgia M. Reash. Building on the global tide to bring justice to women and girls who have suffered sexual assault and harassment, the installation is intended to weave the beauty of art with spoken word and community conversations into an opportunity for learning, solidarity, and healing. The installation serves as an honorarium to the 53 U.S. million (plus) women who have experienced sexual assault or rape since 2001.

#53VV is a tasteful presentation of abstract and contemporary art interpretations of women's genitalia. Each painting offers a savory meaning with intriguing titles and subtitles, inclusive of

slang and uncommon terminology. The colorful paintings are depicted in a flavorful food motif, creating a sensual event that invites smiles, laughter, and learning. The unique 'edible' vagina-art is intended to raise awareness around the largest and longest standing public health pandemic in the world - the sexual assault of women. Feast on the beauty of every delicate morsal and bring honor to those who have survived!

#53VV celebrates women, the strength of survivors, and the joy of healing the wounds of trauma.



Using creativity and facilitated community engagement, #53VV provides a one-of-a-kind "healing-arts placemaking event" that harnesses the power of visual art, the written / spoken word and education into a powerful art experience.

#### **About the Artist**

Over the past 21 years, Georgia's emergence as an author, painter, playwright, poet and storyteller has focused on using her creative gifts as a tool for helping others heal, especially women who have experienced sexual assault or harassment. As a transformational artist, she uses visual art and the power of the written and spoken word to create a healing-arts experience.

Georgia's artistic career spans 22 years starting first with *Metamorphosis*<sup>©</sup>, an 18-piece art installation (2004) depicting her mental health recovery and

spiritual awakening milestones. The collection was also integrated into Georgia's first theater production, *Journey of the Hummingbird Minister*<sup>©</sup> (2006), featuring her dramatic 'phoenix rising' story. Her most recent art installation, #53 Vaginas and Vulvas (2019) offers a unique and inviting approach to raising awareness around sexual assault through a 53-piece collection of women's genitalia. Georgia created them as a personal healing celebration, and in honor of the 53 million U.S. women who have been sexually assaulted since 2001.

Georgia's new book (2022), I Want Good Sex: Reclaiming the Power of Your Sexuality After Living with Abuse, Assault or Stupid Meanies integrates poetry, art and strategies for reclaiming the Aphrodite Within, after sexual assault trauma. Her published poetry includes Weed Flowers Book 1: Sensualities (2018) and the Creatrix Life (2007). Georgia's poetry has been featured in Ohio Beacon Arts (6/20), Equity Literature (10/20), and Women Who Roar (1/21). She was also honored as 2<sup>nd</sup> place winner at the Cleveland Hessler Street Fair competition. In Summer 2020, Georgia was featured as one among 101 women artists in the national Scheherazade Project.

In addition to her life as a writer and artist, Georgia serves as President of BrightSpot Communities LLC, a company dedicated to the development of affordable and sustainable communities and thriving organizations.
